

They are fast, agile, tough, relentless, and - like their human counterparts - unwavering in their dedication and loyalty. The dogs and their work on the battlefield were recently the subject of a segment on 60 Minutes.

These dogs often sustain serious injuries, and even die in battle, so that human lives can be saved. The Warrior Dog Foundation supports dogs who have been injured in battle or retired from duty, and also supports Special Operations soldiers and their families.
